GROW IN YOUR FAITH - Questions of the Week

In John's account of that first Easter night, Jesus appears through locked doors and gives the disciples His peace. He gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit and the power of God's forgiveness. Thomas, who misses out on this experience of Jesus, refuses to believe unless he can touch Jesus' wounds. A week later he has a chance to do just that! Thomas exclaims, "My Lord and my God!" And Jesus tells us how "blest" are we who have believed in His resurrection without having seen His risen body.

<u>Adults:</u> How does the story of Thomas coming to faith resemble your own journey? Jesus said: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." How will you show your belief in Jesus this week?

<u>Children:</u> Thomas didn't believe because he hadn't seen Jesus with his own eyes. How hard is it for you to believe in Jesus without being able to see Him? How do you see Jesus in the words and actions of others? How can you show Jesus to another person this week by how you act?

Think of God's gifts in broader terms, not simply the material goods or security you may enjoy.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Easter is a time of change in the Christian way of life. It starts with grace and affords us the opportunity to make other changes in our attitude and behaviors.

When Kody was baptized at the Easter Vigil a few days ago, we talked about the opportunity for change that baptism brings. If he wants to be a "whole new person" in how he talks and acts, baptism is the perfect excuse. What a perfect time to say to one's coworkers and friends, "I cannot do X anymore, because it does not fit with being a baptized Christian."

All of us who are baptized have a great excuse for why we would make positive changes in our life. Even though we may have been baptized many years ago, God can rise up grace within us to want to change our behaviors. We can call it "ongoing conversion." Or another way to see it is like "ongoing education for work," where we go to a conference and suddenly change the way we perform our duties because of something we learn there. So too, in our discipleship as Christians, we should always be open to new graces from Jesus in the Easter season. Lent was a time of reflecting and pursuing reform, and now we can actively make changes for the long-term, if we are willing to cooperate with God's grace.

Change is never easy. Yet, we have all had positive experiences of a kind of "freedom" that arrives when we are willing to make changes. I can tell you that the remodel projects at St. Ann's right now are both frightening and freeing. There are unknowns in change that can sometimes paralyze us with fear of "what if it does not work out right?" Yet, the initial reasons for remodeling were for our safety and the longterm well-being of the facilities. So, we keep moving forward, and daily progress gives us hope of what will be. Along the way, we are feeling some great freedom in how beautiful the church will look when it is done.

The resurrection of Jesus was a radical change for the disciples. "Is he really alive? That changes everything!" Suddenly, the meaning and purpose of our existence on earth was made clearer. A grace was given to them to also change how they viewed themselves and what they were going to do with their time on earth.

What changes might God be asking you to make in your life these days? Be not afraid. God will give you the grace to reform whatever he is calling you to do.
